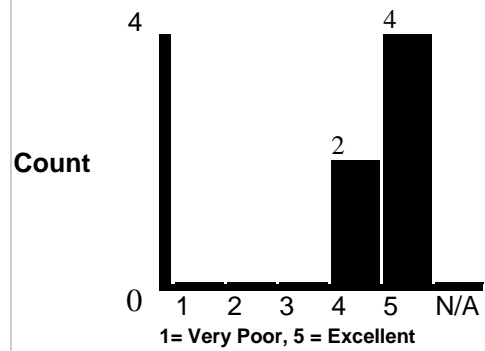

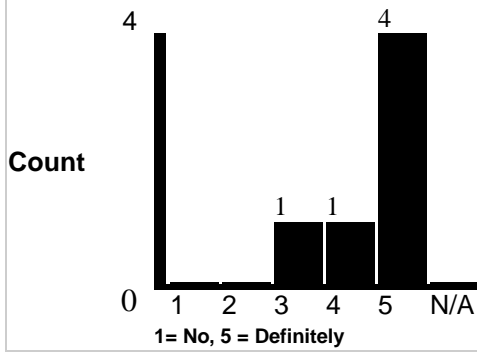

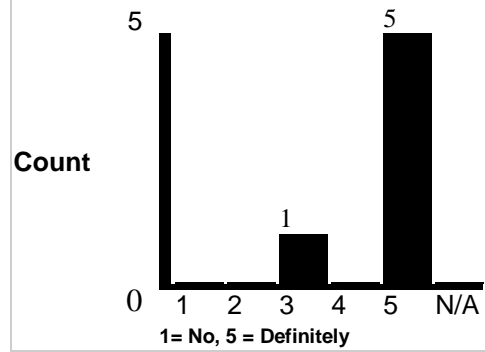

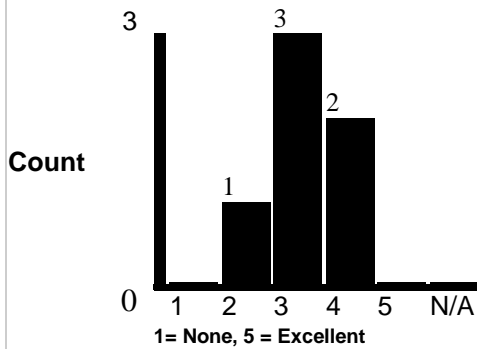

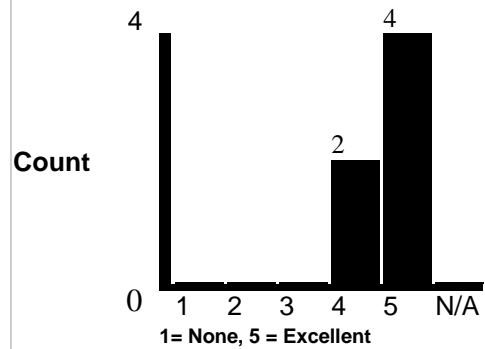
Are you likely to apply information from this course in the workplace
